Context:

Uzbekistan's national priorities:

- to widen access to quality education, including through TNE development
- to elevate Uzbekistan universities' global standing
- to strengthen internationalisation and greater integration into the global education community.

Uzbekistan is the tenth largest host nation for TNE provision in Asia with a total of **10000 students** studying on UK taught programmes.

The proposed initiative is the outcome of discussions at the Uzbekistan-UK Education Forums held in 2023 and 2024.



Objectives of the Network:

- To provide networking opportunities for TNE providers working in Uzbekistan
- To share good practice across the network (TNE organisational issues, QA, student experience, employability, sustainability development, research)
- To identify and address challenges for TNE development
- To focus on social mission of universities
- To establish a knowledge sharing platform to support more scalable and sustainable TNE
- To develop capacity for TNE development in Uzbekistan and develop CoP to champion change and innovation
- To develop 'joined up thinking' strategies to ensure that all stakeholders collaborate with the aim of delivering the best education possible
- To make the network sustainable.



Key principles:

- Mutuality: we learn from those we interact, and they learn from us
- Creativity: we encourage people to develop new ideas in an environment of trust
- Inclusion: we encourage participation so that everyone feels valued, heard, respected and involved, we aim to support trust between people in different countries and across the organisations.
- Decisions to be taken based on clear understanding of needs and engagement with key stakeholders.
